



LED ZEPPELIN – THE RIDE **FACT SHEET**

- Jimmy Page named the attraction and selected "Whole Lotta Love" for the on-board song
- A Bolliger & Mabillard sitting coaster, each train holds 32 people (four wide, eight rows)
- Each train weighs 26,345 pounds
- Each train is equipped with on-board audio - 64 speakers and 1200 watts per train
- Total length of track is 3,738 feet (0.7 mile)
- Lift height is 155 feet
- The coaster is 13 inches below the FAA envelope (essentially, built as high as the FAA will allow)
- Six inversions
- 120-foot-tall loop
- 95-foot-tall cobra roll
- 75-foot-tall zero G roll
- Total weight of track and structure: 1.2 million pounds (approximate)
- Maximum speed: 65 mph
- And part of it is over water

Led Zeppelin - An English rock band formed in 1968 and composed of guitarist Jimmy Page, vocalist Robert Plant, drummer John Bonham, and bass guitarist and keyboardist John Paul Jones. Over 25 years after disbanding in response to Bonham's 1980 death, Led Zeppelin continues to be held in high regard for their artistic achievements, commercial success, and broad influence. The band has sold more than 300 million albums worldwide, including 109.5 million sales in the United States. Led Zeppelin is ranked No. 1 on VH1's list of the 100 greatest artists of hard rock.

"Whole Lotta Love" is a song from their second album, *Led Zeppelin II*. It was their first hit single. The song entered the Billboard Top 40 singles chart on December 6, 1969. It remained on the chart for 13 weeks, peaking at #4 and becoming the band's only Top 10 single in the U.S. A famous show closer at Led Zeppelin concerts, it was usually performed as a medley of blues and R&B covers favored by the band.
