



BOHEMIAN RHAPSODY NIGHT SHOW FACT SHEET

- Can Be Seen on Scheduled Evenings
- Length of Show: 6 minutes
- Venue: 9 acre lagoon viewed 360° along the water's edge
- Audience Capacity: 10,000
- Illuminated Gibson Guitar Icon: Specially programmed neon and strobes.
- Fireworks: 1000+ pieces of multicolored pyrotechnic product positioned on 3 center barges and 40 perimeter pylons
- LASER: An intense green 50 watt "YAG" Laser (Nd:YAG [neodymium-doped yttrium aluminium garnet; Nd:Y₃Al₅O₁₂] is a crystal that is used as a lasing medium for solid-state lasers.)
- Show Fountains: 11
 - 10 Fountains reaching up to 60 feet in height
 - 1 Featured Fountain reaching up to 80 feet in height surrounded by concentric 20 foot and 40 foot fountain rings
 - 125 supporting fountains

"Bohemian Rhapsody" – Written by Freddie Mercury, was originally recorded by Queen for their 1975 album *A Night at the Opera*. The song is in the style of a stream-of-consciousness nightmare, and has a very unusual musical structure for a piece of popular music (it has no chorus, instead consisting of various seemingly disjunct sections including operatic segments and an a cappella and heavy metal part). Despite this, it was released as a single and became a huge commercial success. It is ranked #163 on the *Rolling Stone* magazine's list of "the 500 Greatest Songs of All Time".
